ABOUT MERZ TRIO

Merz Trio's adventurous programming brings together the scintillating harmonies of Alma Mahler and Alban Berg with the rapturous evocations of Hildegard and Cheryl Frances-Hoad and the bold, inspired strokes of a young, 16-year-old Dmitri Shostakovich. Through this common thread of tone painting, each composer is featured at their most colorful and inspired, and the Brahms Trio that ends the program is no exception. Though rarely thought of as an orchestrator or tone painter first and foremost, we hear the C Major Trio freshly in this context and we understand Brahms afresh as a virtuoso texturist, composing for this instrumentation with an incredible subtlety and imagination.
